

1st – 3rd Grade - \$75 per class/hour

Anatomy, Teacher: TBA, Suggested Text: 9781935495147, Supply Fee: \$10

Through hands-on learning, your student will learn about the intricate details of the human body. The semester will begin with a brief overview of the history of medicine, and move on to an overview of DNA and cells, as well as anatomy and physiology. Each lesson is designed to point back to God and give Him glory for the way He designed each of us. From each hair on our heads, to the tips of our toes, we will discover it all together!

Fun With Fables, Teacher: Donna Wilson, Supply Fee: \$5, no text required

In this unique course, students will be acting, singing, and crafting their way through the classic fables and the lessons they teach us. The stories will be used to not only teach us moral and Biblical lessons, but also valuable literacy skills, like vocabulary, story structure, critical thinking, and writing development.

Hands-on History (HOH) - Ancient History, Teacher: Lisa Farrell, Suggested Text: TBA, Supply Fee: \$10

Journey back with us to the ancient days as we uncover historical facts and the figures that laid the foundation of our civilization. Come prepared each week to learn with all your senses as we participate in hands-on learning through activities, crafts, games, songs, and snacks. (All levels of Ancient History will be coordinated for seamless family learning.)

Math Games 1, Teacher: Joannah Manuel, Supply Fee: \$5, no text required

Students will be introduced to math concepts by playing games, singing, and living math stories! Every week this class will have hands-on experiences in order to clearly understand the strategies to solving math problems. Come and join us to see how much fun math can really be!

Reading Buddies, Teacher: Donna Wilson, Supply Fee: \$5, no text required

Budding readers will have an opportunity to experience a reading circle, story time, spelling and vocabulary, and growing in their literacy skills, all within a group setting. Grab a buddy and let's have fun with oral reading, story sharing, beginning writing, and making friends (real life and fictional). We will be using classic reading handbooks, like the Dick and Jane series, to help us develop our foundation in phonics and sight word knowledge.

4th – 6th - \$75 per class/hour

Anatomy, Teacher: Julia Fregoso, Suggested Text: 9781935495147, Supply Fee: \$10

Using Apologia's *Exploring Creation with Human Anatomy and Physiology* as our guide, we will be learning interesting and fun facts about the human body. In this class, students will focus on reviewing the weekly material through games, experiments, and subject related projects, all while keeping a notebook journal to document their discoveries along the way.

Art Masters, Teacher: Kristi Viera, Supply Fee : \$15, no text required

Welcome to the wonderful world of art! Students will travel through history studying many of the great artists throughout the ages, while learning art basics through hands-on projects and crafts. From basic lines and shading, to sculptures and comics, each class time will be spent in highly engaging activities and lessons. Join us as we study this broad scope of topics, including the principles of color, styles of art and perspective, portraiture, carving, and cartooning along with the artists who pioneered each one. No previous experience or knowledge required!

Grossology, Teacher: Kristi Viera, Supply Fee : \$10, no text required

Diving into places normally too gross to go, this class will explore everything from hiccups and rashes, to animal and household grossness. Each hour will be spent learning the science behind all things slimy, sticky and oozing, as well as completing hands-on activities and experiments to reinforce our lessons. While not your typical science class, students will have a blast learning the reasons behind the gross, and how truly amazing all of creation is!

Hands-on History (HOH) - Ancient History, Teacher: Mandy Adcock, Suggested text: TBA, Supply Fee: \$10

Their writing assignments will follow ancient history chronologically.

Inventions and Inventors, Teacher: Kristi Viera, Supply Fee: \$15, no text required

Our world is filled with so many wonderful gadgets, do-dads, and technology. Have you ever considered where these things came from, or who created each one? After all, they certainly make our daily lives easier! During this class, students will study inventions throughout history as well as the wonderful minds behind each one. Each lesson will be completed with an invention of the student's own making. Students will engage in math, engineering, art, and creativity while studying the inventions that shape our world today!

Literature Club, Teacher: Kristi Viera, Suggested Texts: Various works of classic literature TBA, Supply Fee: \$10

Grab your passports and travel with us across the globe as we journey through the wonderful world of literature! From far off worlds, to other time periods, students will travel far and wide while adventuring through engaging lessons, activities, projects, and fun! Students will read selected novels in the comfort of their homes, while completing corresponding discussions, projects, and activities during class! Are you ready for adventure?

Lego Boost, Teacher: Joannah Manuel, Supply Fee: \$15, no text required

In Lego Boost, students will learn how to build, program, and use several different robots made from Legos. It will be an exciting and dynamic world of Lego building and learning! The second component of this class will include learning the technique of stop motion animation! Students, in groups, will be given the opportunity to produce, direct, and collaborate a "short" using Legos! Extra parent volunteers will be needed for this class. Smart phones may be needed for the Lego Stop Motion Application.

Math Games 2, Teacher: Joannah Manuel, Supply Fee: \$5, no text required

This will be an hour filled with fun along with the mastery of mathematics! We are taking this journey, sometimes outdoors, and teaming up to take our skills to the next level using real life application with each student's own strategies. There will be friendly competition games to help with speed and memorization. Every student will be challenged as they progressively improve their knowledge of basic math facts, and fact families in multiplication and division. We will also be going over fractions, decimals, algebra readiness, estimation, measurements with cooking, geometry, data, and the use of problem solving plans...with a few sing a-longs too!

Music Appreciation, Teacher: Joy Luna, Supply Fee: \$10, no text required

A love for music is our goal! This class will explore different styles of music and will learn from different historic and modern figures that make music fun! Students will also have the opportunity to experiment with different types of instruments. Find your creativity in music! (No experience required.)

Jr. High - \$120 per class/hour

Algebra ½, Teacher: Lisa Schron, Suggested Text: 9781565771499

Has your student completed Saxon 8/7, but would like more time to master concepts before moving on to Algebra 1? This class is perfect for you then! While much of the content is similar to 8/7, it pushes students a little closer to Algebra 1, and presents material in a more "textbook-y" format, getting them ready for the dreaded ... Algebra! Content is presented in simple language, with songs, goofy sayings, and a silly math teacher to encourage them along the way.

Ancient History, Teacher: Tess Berry, Text: TBA, Supply Fee: \$10

Students will be engaged in hands-on learning about the history of mankind from Ancient Egypt to Ancient India. We will have fun learning through the text and through producing visual, written, and oral projects. (All levels of Ancient History learning will be coordinated for seamless family learning.)

Heroes of the Faith, Teacher: Joy Luna, Suggested Text: provided with registration, Supply Fee: \$10

This class will look to the lives of Godly people through history, and their adventures as they sought to obey God. Our objective will be to learn from their examples of faith through the most difficult circumstances in life. Let us journey through the places God called them to, and discover how they shared His love for others. We will explore the cultures, geography, and traditions of the people our "heroes of faith" served, too!

IEW – Ancient History, Teacher: Taylor Klemin, Suggested Text: (IEW.com) AHW-S, Supply Fee: \$5

This course is a path to pain-free writing skills for your junior high and high schoolers. Students will write on topics that explore the civilizations of Sumer, Egypt, Israel, Babylon, Greece, Rome, Asia Minor, and Asia—the people's ideas, traditions, systems of government, feats, and wonderful skills. They will sharpen their grammar skills thru Fix It! Grammar. Designed to teach advanced writing skills, students will learn to write from notes, write narrative stories, summarize from multiple references, write from pictures, inventive writing, formal critiques, and response to literature essays.

Literature Club, Teacher: Kristi Viera, Suggested Texts: Various works of classic literature TBA, Supply Fee: \$10

Journey through the wonderful world of literature! Students will discover new worlds and embark on harrowing adventures, while learning new vocabulary and literary concepts. Students will enjoy reading selected novels in the comfort of their own homes, while class time will be focused on literary discussion, engaging activities - both indoors and out, projects, geography, and art! Watch literature come alive as students travel through time and across the globe!

Physical Science, Teacher: Michael DeSarro, Suggested Text: 9781932012774, Supply Fee: \$10

This class will take you on an amazing journey! We will begin with a detailed discussion of the world around us, and what makes it work. Then we will journey out into the universe to learn the majesty of God's creation. This interesting and challenging course will take you from the inner workings of atoms, to the grandeur of galaxies. Be prepared to be awed and amazed with what the Creator has made for you!

Saxon 8/7, Pre Algebra, Teacher: Holly Croley, Text: 9781591413202

Saxon 8/7 is a great foundation for our growing math students. This text does a wonderful job of reviewing the vital concepts needed to move to higher-level math courses, while introducing bits of algebra along the way.

Extended High School Science Courses - \$180 per class/hour

Biology 8:30-10:00, Teacher: Tess Berry, Suggested Text: 9781932012545, Supply Fee: \$10

From the study of the five-kingdom classification system, to cellular biology, to genetics, students will get a very thorough instruction of the systems of life. Textbook reading, robust vocabulary, class discussion, and hands-on labs and dissections will equip students for a full experience and understanding of biology.

Chemistry 8:05-10:00, Teacher: Sue Strother, Suggested Text: TBA, Supply Fee: \$15

High School Chemistry is a college-prep, lab course in which students will be challenged to master the fundamental principles of matter, from the invisible atom to chemical reactions including composition, displacement, decomposition, combustion, acid-base reactions, and oxidation-reduction reactions. These reactions, along with electrochemistry and thermodynamics, will be explored through engaging labs, and students will learn to describe and analyze them.

Geology 2:00-3:30, Teacher: Tess Berry, Suggested Text: 9780134074252, Supply Fee: \$15

This course will dive into the study of the Earth's geology. Geology covers the study of the Earth, its rocks, and the processes by which they change. Geology is a fun and interesting alternative to meet the requirement of high school physical science with a lab. Students will have the opportunity to participate in a weeklong camping trip through some of God's greatest geological wonders including Zion, Bryce Canyon, and Arches.

High School - \$140 per class/hour

Algebra 1, Teacher: Holly Croley, Suggested Text: 9781565771345

Saxon's Algebra 1 is a traditional, high school Algebra course. It covers concepts such as exponents, solving equations, graphing, unit multipliers, signed numbers, and many other FUNDamentals.

Algebra 2, Teacher: TBA, Suggested Text: 9781565771406

This course marks the completion of algebraic studies. It exposes students to advanced concepts like complex equations with 3 variables, chemistry related problems, quadratic formulas, and uniform motion.

British Literature, Teacher: Taylor Klemin, Suggested Text: provided with registration, Supply Fee: \$5

Students will take an in depth look at well known British novels, as well as Romantic, Victorian and Modern British poetry. They will learn to interpret literature, analyze characters, and answer thought provoking questions. In addition, students will develop their written and verbal expressions through book reviews, essays, and class discussions. Students will be expected to engage with the texts through discussion, writing, and projects. This course is designed for upper high school grade levels.

Geometry, Teacher: Griselda Ortega, Suggested Text: 9781602773059

Students in this course will learn about conceptual foundations of Geometry, and will also discover how common it is utilized in today's modern world.

Government, Teacher: Griselda Ortega, Supply Fee: \$15, no text required

In this course, students will learn about the election process, including understanding the primaries and caucuses, the general election process, analyzing the candidates and their ad campaigns, as well as many other projects and in-class activities geared towards helping your students become educated voters, while having fun doing so. In addition, we will be doing an in-depth study of our U.S. Constitution using the workbook 'Constitutional Literacy' by Michael Farris, founder of Home School Legal Defense and Patrick Henry College, which will prepare our students to become responsible enlightened citizens with a constitutional knowledge and understanding. (1st Semester - Government, 2nd Semester - Economics)

World History, Teacher: Lisa Schron, Suggested Text: 9780547491141, Supply Fee: \$5

World History is a course that will expose your student to *how* modern culture was built. Starting with the foundations and influence of Judeo-Christian and Greco-Roman philosophies, we will move through history to important periods like the Age of Enlightenment, American Revolution, the Industrial Revolution, the world wars, and on toward post-war Modernism and Nation building strategies. After completing this course, students will have a better understanding of the world around them today!

World Literature, Teacher: Lisa Farrell, Suggested Text: provided with registration, Supply Fee: \$5

Students will be introduced to authors from around the world. They will read stories, poetry, and plays from long ago and far away that represent many cultures and times. This course will help to enhance their critical thinking and analysis skills. They will have an in-depth study on ancient poetry, folktales, and other early literature, as well as writings from medieval period, the Renaissance, the Enlightenment, and modern times. Students will be expected to participate in class discussions, writing, and projects.

Jr. High and High School Electives- \$140 per class/hour

ASL 1, Teacher: Amber Mitchell, Suggested Text: provided with registration

This class will focus on the basics of communication such as ABC's, counting, and dialog in ASL as well as grammar and vocabulary. Students will not only learn the basics of communication, but also the dynamics of respectful interaction that expresses emotion and compassion to the deaf community.

ASL 2/3, Teacher: Amber Mitchell, Suggested Text: provided with registration

This class will focus on building students' vocabulary and translations of ASL to English and vice versa. Students will start to put all the skills that they have learned together to paint a beautiful picture of the language that is ASL. They will progress to more in depth learning about position, location, classifiers, and morphemes.

Crochet, Teacher: Judith Leon, no text required

Welcome to a fun, hands-on class in the world of crochet. We will learn how to choose the needle that works best with each yarn, and most important, how to read patterns; this always seems to be the hardest to learn. We will discover how to make a chain, change color/yarn, how to do the different stitches, become familiar with all the abbreviations like: (sc: single crochet, hdc: half-double crochet, dc: double crochet, tc: triple crochet, etc.) We will be make few projects, such as a scarf, beanie, and grannie square blanket. Students should be able to continue to crochet on their own after this class.

Due to yarn and color preference, students will bring their own yarn/needle for each project. Prior to class starting, a supply list will be provided.

Defending the Faith, Teacher: Michael DeSarro, Suggested Text: Defending Your Faith: A 12 Lesson Series on Apologetics by Dr Mark Bird (Answers in Genesis SKU 10-2-272)

Do you know WHY you believe what you believe? Defending Your Faith is an interesting, interactive, and relevant class designed to equip your student to defend their faith. We will cover topics such as the existence of God, the reliability of the New Testament, creation vs. evolution and the resurrection of Christ - because every Christian needs to be able to give a defense to everyone who asks a reason for the hope that lies within Him! (1 Peter 3:15)

Desktop Publishing with Microsoft Office, Teacher: Britt Schron, no text required – **Interest List!**

This course is a MUST for every student! Having a good foundation in Microsoft's Office programs is crucial for students and business professionals. This course will aid students in learning a good foundation to help them be more successful in the future. They will learn vital tools to improve their written work, ability to start and efficiently use spreadsheets, create dynamic presentations, and more! This class may be taught utilizing online based live instruction with a classroom supervisor, and monthly in-person instruction from the teacher.

Home Economics, Teacher: Lisa Farrell, Supply Fee: \$20, no text required

This is sure to be an exciting, interactive, life-skill building course! Students will cover everything from banking, to meal planning, to basic cooking skills, to working with textiles. This course will not only be fun, but will prepare our students for independence!

Programming 101, Teacher Joy Luna, Supply fee: \$35, no text required

Are you interested in learning how to code? Explore the possibilities of programming with Raspberry Pi. Students will explore computer science by working on projects such as building their own computer, gaming console, robots, and more. Little to no experience is required - just a desire to learn!

Spanish 1, Teacher: Judith Leon, Suggested Text: 9780972857093, Supply Fee: \$5

This introductory course will introduce students not only to the Spanish language, but the cultures of Spanish speaking countries as well. Each lesson focuses on themed-based vocabulary and grammar instruction. In a group setting, students will have the opportunity to hear and practice proper pronunciations, participate in games, and sample authentic treats!

Spanish 2, Teacher: Griselda Ortega, Suggested Text: 9780990312277, Supply Fee: \$10

This year students will continue to build upon their foundation from Spanish I. Our focus this year will be to practice our conversation skills, while also continuing to build our grammar. They will be provided with new vocabulary, advanced grammatical concepts, various practice exercises, review tests, dialogue practiced in and out of class, various literary works, and numerous review games. Students will be hearing, modeling, and conversing with each other to develop their fluency. These skills will be acquired through homework and in class activities, projects and quizzes.

Spanish 3, Teacher: Griselda Ortega, Suggested Text: 9780990312260, Supply Fee: \$10

Spanish 3 will be a fluency builder. Student will build upon the fundamentals learned and mastered in Spanish I and 2. Students will be hearing, modeling, and conversing with each other to develop their fluency. They will engage in conversation, provide and obtain information, express feelings and emotions, and exchange opinions. We will review and build upon the vocabulary and writing using grammar at a basic/intermediate level. Students will learn thru a variety of fun games, class presentations, and class activities. Examples of our in-class activities include Spanish Vocabulary Jenga, Trashketball (of course), speaking on a given subject for 1 minute, journal writing, dialogue practice with partners, reading basic Spanish books as a class, etc. These skills will be acquired through homework and in-class activities, projects and quizzes.

The Voice: Singing with Joy, Teacher: Dana Bailey, Supply Fee: \$15 No text required; digital music downloads will be provided

This class will encourage and equip students to experience the joy and fun of singing! God intended our unique and individual singing voices to be used with a spirit of joy, not a spirit of timidity and fear! Through group choral songs as well as solo songs in a variety of musical styles, students will learn the fundamentals of good singing techniques, including breathing and posture, tone production and vowel sounds, and stage presence and performance skills, which will provide them with the tools they need to sing with boldness. Over the course of the semester they will gradually build their confidence to share their voice with others. Fun activities based on the popular TV show "The Voice" will be used, but incorporating uplifting Biblical encouragement without the competitive "create-a-star" elements of the show format. For ages 11 and up: Beginners to advanced: all levels of experience are welcome.

Ukulele, Teacher: TBA, no text required – **Interest List!**

No experience required! The goal of this course is to introduce students to the basics of ukulele including how to hold the instrument, strumming techniques, reading music, the basics of music theory and song writing, basic chords, and rhythm.

Extended Elective - \$180

Theater 2:00-4:00, Teacher: Trish Evans, Supply Fee: \$20, no text required

Theater is more than a class - it's an adventure! Students will learn the skills of public speaking and stage presence, which are both useful for job interviews and professional presentations. They will also develop teamwork abilities, responsibility and commitment, and forge friendships. This class fulfills high school fine arts requirements. First semester we will present an assembly production on the last day of classes, as well as monthly short skits during the semester. Extra rehearsal outside of class may be required.
