Wednesday Class Descriptions

Preschool & Kindergarten \$165 per class/hour

Preschool & Kindergarten Circle Time, teacher: Alicia Dallas

Teamwork, creativity, and critical thinking are encouraged as students work together to measure, model, and build with purpose.

Ancient World History, teacher: Lisa Schron

Supply fee: \$10

This course provides a survey of ancient civilizations, from the earliest societies to the fall of Rome. Students will explore key historical events, cultural developments, political structures, and economic systems that shaped the ancient world. Through the study of primary sources, geography, and influential figures, students will gain a deeper understanding of how ancient civilizations laid the foundation for the modern era. New students are welcome for the spring semester.

General Science, teacher: Holly Croley

Suggested text: ISBN 9781932012866

Supply fee: \$10

This course covers many foundational topics for higher level sciences, including the scientific method, designing experiments, simple machines, archaeology, geology, paleontology, biology, human anatomy and physiology. The course will focus on learning through reading, responding, class discussion, and engaging hands-on activities including all important labs and experiments. In addition to the scholarly learning, this text highlights God's authority, creativity, and mastery in creation and therefore arms students with apologetic knowledge as well. It's a win-win! This is a year long course and requires instructor approval for any new student wanting to register for the spring semester.

Students will write about intriguing topics such as Socrates, plate tectonics, and other interesting subjects while they learn to write with the IEW Structure and Style writing method. Throughout the course of the school year, students will learn note making and outlines, writing from notes, retelling narrative stories, summarizing references, writing from pictures, summarizing multiple references, inventive writing, formal essay models, and formal critique. Students who were not enrolled in this class for the fall semester need to contact the teacher before enrolling.

Literary Analysis, teacher: Donna Wilson

There is so much to learn from books and especially books that bring you into other times, places, and even imaginary worlds. As we read amazing works of fiction, non-fiction, short stories, poems and biographies we will discover how to think critically, empathize with characters, expand our vocabulary and learn the importance of the written word. Classes will be filled with discussions, analyzing, working through the main elements of literature, projects and more. The goal of this class is to inspire students to grow in their love of reading and learning through literature. New students are welcome for the spring semester.

Pre-Algebra, teacher: Griselda Carlson

Supply fee: \$5

Pre-algebra is a great stepping-stone to Algebra 1 for students who need a little more practice or a little more confidence. It continues to reinforce foundational math concepts while introducing a little more algebra.. The class will include instruction each week on 4-5 lessons, in-class quizzes and tests, and hands-on activities. Parents are responsible for grading homework daily to catch mistakes early! We will be using the third edition of the text. New students are welcome to join; class will start on lesson 60.

9th-12th Core Classes - \$200 per class/hour

Astronomy, teacher: Sue Strother

An awe-inspiring, science elective, Astronomy motivates stargazing, fine-tunes understanding of discovery, and expands appreciation of God's creation. With the Apologia textbook as our guide, this class will enhance learning with games, discussions, and short projects. Please feel free to contact Mrs. Strother if you are considering joining this 2-semester class for only the 2nd semester.

Economics & Entrepreneurship, teacher: Griselda Carlson

This course is designed to give the students a basic understanding of economics as well as a good foundation on how to start and run a small business. Students will learn the study of economics blended with entrepreneurial principles. They will have a practical understanding of economics as it applies to small business, as well a traditional understanding of economics as it applies to our national and global economy. Books include Abeka's Economics Work & Prosperity (3rd Edition) and Starting A Micro Business and Running a Micro Business by Carol Topp (2 small books). This is a one semester class.

Journey through the wonderful world of literature! Students will discover new worlds and embark on harrowing adventures, while learning vocabulary, grammar, and literary devices. Students will enjoy reading selected novels, poetry, and short stories from the comfort of their own homes, while class time will be focused on discussion, group work, and engaging activities! We will learn the requirements of differing response styles and focus on how to analyze literary works. This course encompasses all the requirements for a high school level English course. New students are welcome for the spring semester.

Math Courses

Class times will cover an average of four lessons a week with suggested homework material to adequately fulfill high school math requirements. These courses are designed to teach the student to learn while supporting the parent in their home instruction. Parents are responsible for grading homework daily to catch mistakes early!

Algebra 1, teacher: Holly Croley

Suggested text: ISBN 9781565771345, Solutions manual highly encouraged

Supply fee: \$5

Algebra 1 is a foundational year of learning the basic concepts of Algebra to carry the student through high school math. Class times will cover an average of four lessons a week with suggested homework material to adequately fulfill high school math requirements. This course is designed to teach the student to learn while supporting the parent in the home instruction. This is a year long course and requires instructor approval for any new student wanting to register for spring semester.

Algebra 2, teacher: Holly Croley

Extended High School Sciences - \$300 per class

Biology, teacher: Holly Croley

From a study of the five-kingdom classification system to cellular biology, to genetics, students will get a very thorough instruction of the systems of life. Class will include textbook reading, microscope usage, robust vocabulary, class discussion, hands-on labs and the all-important dissections. This class will equip students for a full experience and understanding of biology. No adds at this time without prior approval.

Chemistry, teacher: Sue Strother

Suggested texts: Discovering Design with Chemistry with Answer Key and Tests Booklet

ISBN 099627846X, ISBN 0996278478

Supply fee: \$10

An exhilarating, college-preparatory, lab science, this class covers fundamental aspects of chemistry such as the classification of matter, atomic structure, spectroscopy, chemical bonding, molecular geometry, physical change, chemical change, stoichiometry, solutions, ideal gases, acid/base chemistry, reduction/oxidation reactions, thermochemistry, thermodynamics, kinetics, and chemical equilibrium. Weaving together concepts and their mathematical applications, the course teaches students how to think as a chemist so they can analyze the major changes that occur in matter. Our class time will focus on introduction to concepts, labs per curriculum, and alternative/ supplemental labs and demonstrations. Weekly homework assignments require 4-8 hours to complete. Tests are assigned to be completed outside of class, so parents can determine the method of test-taking. Please feel free to contact Mrs. Strother if you are considering joining this 2-semester class for only the 2nd semester. Prerequisite: Algebra I

7th-12th Electives - \$200 per class/hour

Codes of Conduct

The following are guidelines for maintaining a safe and respectful environment while at 10:10 Academy, so that you and your family can enjoy your experience and get the most out of every week!

BEHAVIOR CODE

Students:

- Students are expected to show obedience, respect and attention to all instructors, staff, parents and church staff. If a child's behavior is continually disruptive or disrespectful a meeting with the Leadership Team will be set up.
- Students are also expected to show kindness and respect to other students regardless of age.
- No foul language should be used on our campus.
- Students are expected to keep their hands to themselves; violent behavior will be addressed immediately between Leadership and parents.
- Students are expected to treat our host Church with respect. This means leaving classrooms better than they found them, playing in designated areas only, and using appropriate volume when near the Church Office.

Parents:

- Under no circumstances should a parent confront a student if they believe a student has committed a "wrong" against a teacher, volunteer, or student attending 10:10 Academy. We ask that you stop, pray about the offense, and if it is something that needs to be followed up on, please see a member of the Leadership Team for direction on how to handle the situation. Parents are expected to model Christian behavior towards students, other parents, staff, and church staff.

DRESS CODE

If you are dressed inappropriately, or not modestly as decided by the Leadership Team and the dress code guidelines, you will be asked to wear a 10:10 Academy T-shirt. We want to give you the freedom to make your own clothing decisions BUT if lines are continually crossed, you will find yourself in a 10:10 Academy T-shirt. Enjoy the freedom but please do not take advantage of it!

Dress code applies to students and all adults.

DRESS CODE GUIDELINES

- No undergarments showing
- Younger students wearing dresses need to wear tights or leggings underneath if they are “active” on the playground or during classes
- Dresses and skirts should reach the end of your middle finger when your hands are rested at your sides (shorter than this with shorts underneath is still not okay!)
- Shorts must have a minimum 5” inseam, and no holes with skin showing above 5”
- Holes in jeans that show skin should follow the fingertip rule
- Tank top straps should be a minimum of one inch wide
- Please no offensive or controversial logos or statements on t-shirt and hats
- For looser fitting tops, please do the “bend over” test to see if you need to add a tank top under your top
- Shirts should cover cleavage and the stomach area at all times, even if arms are raised
- Necklines high enough to cover cleavage

ENFORCEMENT:

- First infraction – student will be given a gentle, verbal warning
- Second infraction – parents will be notified via email
- Third infraction – a meeting will be scheduled with parents

PDA CODE

If romantic relationships develop between students, 10:10 Academy expects students to handle themselves in a Christ-honoring way. No hand holding or public displays of affection should happen while on campus. Leadership will yield authority of managing these relationships to the parents involved as long as these guidelines are being honored.

If they are not honored, Leadership may step in with correction for the students.

Policies & Procedures

ANTI - BULLYING POLICY

Bullying of any form is not tolerated at 10:10 Academy, whether carried out by a child or an adult. Staff, children, and parents will be made aware of the school's position on bullying. Bullying behavior is unacceptable in any form. Repeated violations of this policy can result in disciplinary action and/or up to termination of enrollment.

VISITOR POLICY

10:10 Academy hosts one Visitor's Day per semester for people that are interested in joining our community. You can check the family calendar for Visitor's Day dates. Other than coming on Visitor's Day, visitor's are not allowed on campus while classes are in session. If you have a non-registered child that accompanied you to campus, they must remain with the parent at all times and you must seek prior approval.

Business meetings outside of the 10:10 Academy program need to be conducted off campus.

LUNCH POLICY

The lunch period is a time for nourishment, thanksgiving, and fellowship for both children and parents.

- If you stay for the lunch period, please pack/bring a lunch for your child. We may have a few hot lunch opportunities throughout the year. You will be notified by email about any hot lunch details.
- The Fellowship Hall is where lunch period will start with a few quick announcements and prayer. This is a very important part of our program. Please plan to gather with us for the first 10 minutes of the lunch period each week.
- Lunch may be eaten in the Fellowship Hall or outdoors as long as the students are not disrupting the church office staff, and stay out of the parking lot, driveway, and street. You **MUST** supervise your own children, babies-10 years old, during the lunch hour if they are playing outside.
- You must supervise your own children, babies-10 years old during the lunch hour if they are playing outside. "Supervise" means that your children are in your eyesight at all times.
- Please clean up all of your food and trash from the tables, around you, and on the floor.
- For the safety of students, if children birth-10 years old are found unsupervised by their parent, a meeting with the Leadership Team will be scheduled. Not only is children wandering dangerous, it can lead to us losing our lease with the host Church. We have an open campus where people looking for help, church members, and visitors from the community visit often. To keep kids safe, please make sure to follow these policies.
- Students must stay in areas where there is adult supervision at all times, and should never be unattended in classrooms.

Lunch Play

- Please clean up all of your trash, any trash around you, or any trash on the floor!
- Students birth - 10 years old must be supervised by their parent at all times. "Supervised" means that your children are in your eyesight at all times and less than 6 feet away, if you are not in the designated play areas, where campus supervision is provided
- On the playground, where campus supervision is provided, you need to be actively watching your children, but they may be more than 6 ft away from you.
- In general, students 1st-6th grades and 7th-12th grades should play with others in those age brackets. The official "grade" of the students will be determined by the Leadership Team.
- Toys, balls, and other personal property brought from home and played with are brought at the student's risk. 10:10 Academy is not responsible for damage to personal property.
- 10:10 Academy's lease and insurance policy do not allow wheeled toys to be used on campus, including wheeled tennis shoes, skateboards, scooters, bikes, roller skates and other similar toys.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

We understand that every family has different rules regarding social media use. 10:10 Academy's policy is as follows:

- Teachers are allowed to ACCEPT requests from students
- If teachers accept a friend request from a student, they understand that they are to behave in a manner pleasing to God on social media.
- Teachers are strongly encouraged to notify the student's parent(s) before accepting a friend request.
- Teachers are NOT allowed to use "private message" features to communicate with students; if teachers need to communicate with students, we ask them to email the students and CC the parent(s) or utilize the message feature on our online teacher communication service (Google Classroom).
- Please be aware that your student may still be connected to former 10:10 staff on social media, and you may want to monitor their activity after they are no longer part of our organization.

FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

- Please do not post to social media while on campus. Repeated violations of this by students will result in them losing the right to have a cellular device on campus.
- Pictures and videos can be taken while on campus and posted later
- No pictures should ever be taken in restrooms - this includes mirror selfies
- Parents and students will be respectful of pictures taken on campus to make sure that those in the pictures have approved that their image will be posted online.

CHAT GPT/A.I. APPLICATIONS

Artificial Intelligence applications, such as Chat GPT, are new emergent technology tools. While this new technology can have great research benefits, it is commonly considered plagiarism in academic circles when student's don't produce their own work. Suspected use of these applications will result in immediate notification to the parent. Parents are advised to monitor their student's use of these programs and discuss the severity of plagiarism with their student.

CHURCH PROPERTY

- Please respect the Church policies posted in the bathroom. Please make sure to talk to your kids about this so you are sure they understand.
- No student is ever permitted in the Church Office.
- The Avenue Christian Fellowship will not be held responsible for injuries sustained on church property.
- Students must remain in the leased facilities, which include assigned classrooms, the patio, playground, and basketball courts.
- Please affirm that your children respect the Church's property. If you see inappropriate behavior by your own children, please correct it immediately. If you see other children not respecting Church property, please report it to Admin.

CAMPUS SAFETY

- No running anywhere inside the Fellowship Hall or classrooms
- No rough play, hitting, or kicking
- No climbing up walls, trees or any part of the church building
- Students must stay in areas where there is adult supervision at all times.
- Please drive with extreme caution when entering and exiting the parking lot. Please drive at 5 mph and be alert!
- Students are not permitted to bring pocket knives or other weapons to school. This includes toy weapons, or toys that resemble weapons of any kind. Violation of this policy may result in notification to law enforcement, depending on the severity of the case.

SICK POLICY

Please be respectful of the health of others. If your child has the following symptoms he/she should not attend class:

- Vomiting, diarrhea, colored mucus
- Eye drainage
- Rash (contagious)
- Head lice

MEDICAL FORMS

10:10 Academy must be given current medical information regarding each student. Please complete the medical section in the online registration system, Jumbula.

It is the parent's responsibility to communicate severe allergies, food or otherwise, to the Leadership Team and to each of your student's teachers. Please acknowledge this with an initial on the handbook receipt page.

SEMESTER EVALUATION (GRADES)

Semester Evaluations, or grades, are optional for 7th-12th graders and you must sign up to receive them. Sign-ups will close the third week of classes. You will be emailed directly by teachers at the end of the semester. If you do not receive a Semester Evaluation, please email Griselda@1010Academy.com. For applicable dates, please see your yearly calendar and/or announcements email.

A few reminders:

- It is the parents responsibility to contact the teacher on their student's progress during the semester. We recommend checking in with them half way through the semester, week 8, and one more time prior to finals week, if there is still concern.
- We do not offer progress reports. Please do not email your teachers asking for them. If you need a progress report for your Charter or PSP, please track the graded work coming home each week.
- We only see your child one day a week, and the "grade" may not be reflective of their learning at home.
- 10:10 Academy "grades" are a service and are not official on any transcript or with any agency. We simply try to help you with a suggestion for the work we evaluate.
- Many of us do not homeschool for "grades."
- If you excused your student from work during the semester, the "grade" may not account for that. You are free to adjust the grade you assign with your Charter, PSP, or PSA as you see fit.

STUDY HALL PROCEDURES

Study Hall is a place for 7th-12th grade students to go when they have a free period between classes for \$50 per semester. Please note the following:

- You must sign up for Study Hall in Jumbula.
- If you choose NOT to sign your student up for Study Hall, they need to be physically with you, within 6 feet, and in your line of sight.
- Unless your student has sibling on campus who have classes before or after, or your student is the child of a staff member, your students should not be on campus before their class times or after their class times. Ex: Drop your student off at 9AM for Study Hall when their first class starts at 10AM or your student's last class is at 1PM and you leave them on campus for 2PM Study Hall.

What to expect from Study Hall

- A paid, staff member to oversee those signed up for Study Hall
- Students are expected to sit quietly in Study Hall with a book to read, homework to do, or studying.
- They are allowed to listen to music with ear buds, quietly, or be on their phones.
- Study Hall is expected to be a quiet-ish space and may vary from hour to hour based on the needs of the students.

LOST AND FOUND

10:10 Academy does not maintain a lost and found; items left will be thrown out or donated to charity. Please label all items clearly and be responsible for your child's things before you leave for the day.

COMMUNICATING SUGGESTIONS/CONCERNS

We are happy to accept feedback, questions, and concerns regarding 10:10 Academy business. The following are the official steps to submitting a concern or suggestion.

- Submissions must be emailed to the Program Director(s) and must come from the original party that has the concern or suggestion. No concerns made through a third party will be addressed.
- The Program Director will review concerns and questions and address them judiciously in a reasonable manner. If the situation warrants, the Program Director may consult with the Executive Director, the Parent Advisory Board, and/or other Board Members for suggestions on resolution.

Please see our Conflict Resolution Policy for more details.

CONFLICT RESOLUTION POLICY

“Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother. But if he will not hear, take with you one or two more, that by the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established. And if he refuses to hear them, tell it to the church, let him be to you like a heathen and a tax collector. Assuredly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.” (Matthew 18:15-20)

Because we are all sinners, misunderstandings and personal conflict can occur in any group. At 10:10 Academy we have chosen to base our conflict resolution on the Matthew 18 passage above.

Most disputes or differences can be resolved by overlooking the offense and forgiving the person who has offended. Often conflict arises because of a simple misunderstanding. Because of this, we ask that you pray about the issue to decide if it is important enough to require confrontation. If, after prayer, God gives you the peace to dismiss the issue, then it is over and forgotten and is NOT to be discussed with others. If, however, after prayer, you feel the offense must be addressed, the offended party must first seek to resolve conflict between the two individuals involved. If either party is unsatisfied or a resolution cannot be met, they must seek the assistance of the Leadership Team to mediate. The Leadership Team will then make the final decision regarding steps for resolution.

POLICY VIOLATION ENFORCEMENT

Enforcement of any policy violations will be handled at the discretion of the leadership team, depending on the severity of the infraction. Most infractions of policy may be handled in the following manner:

- First infraction – student will be given a gentle, verbal warning
- Second infraction – parents will be notified via email
- Third infraction – a meeting will be scheduled with parents

Not all violations will follow this stepped approach. When necessary, the Program Director may consult with the Executive Director, Board of Directors, or local authorities.

TERMINATION OF ENROLLMENT

We expect everyone – adults and children alike— to behave in ways that endeavor to enhance our children’s studies in a Christian environment and to promote general Christian fellowship, benevolence, and camaraderie while at our program. We expect the adults to be the examples in this area, treating students and other adults with respect, courtesy, and kindness, according to Biblical principles. Non-biblical actions of members at 10:10 Academy or non-compliance with the by-laws or policies can be grounds for termination of enrollment at the recommendation of the Board, effective immediately after the vote is made. If a family’s enrollment is terminated, the parent will be notified by the Program Director(s) or another designated board member.

Parent Responsibilities

ALL PARENTS

- Read and understand 10:10's Parent/Student Handbook.
- Commit to reading weekly announcements emails and communications sent via email. Most of the communication of important information will be through email. Please check your email and read each correspondence carefully!
- Always give the benefit of the doubt. If you have a question, concern, or feedback to give staff, teachers, or Leadership, or other members of our community, we ask that you first review the Conflict Resolution Policy (included here), pray about the issue, then approach our staff with love and patience, while giving the benefit of the doubt. We are here to serve you and desire healthy, Christ-like interactions.
- Parents should pick up their 12 and older kids from campus on time. On time is considered on the hour.
- Students, of any age, should not ever be in the parking lot unattended. Please do not give your students the keys to your car to retrieve items for you. If students are found unattended in the parking lot, it may cause us to lose our lease. Students should be within 6 feet of you and in your line of sight if you are in the parking lot as a family. The exception to this is students who are 16 years of age AND older, and are licensed drivers. Licensed student drivers who are 16 years of age and older may be in the parking lot only for the purpose of arriving, leaving, or briefly retrieving something from their vehicle. Hanging out in cars or in the parking lot is not permitted for any 10:10 Academy student.
- Please be sensitive to the classroom structure and those who have paid for the class. This includes taking too much of the teacher's time before or after class and asking the teacher if a sibling can participate or join the class for the day. If you have a special request, please see a member of Leadership; we are happy to help!
- Check your family mailbox (found at Admin) and your child's backpack at the end of each day.
- Parents are responsible for purchasing any texts, materials or other items before the start of classes and for paying for their child's classes and any supply fees.
- Please go over the student responsibilities with your student. Please lead by example and follow the student responsibilities that also can apply to you.
- Under no circumstances should a parent confront a student if they believe a student has committed a "wrong" against a teacher, volunteer, or student attending 10:10 Academy. We ask that you stop, pray about the offense, and if it is something that needs to be followed up on, please see a member of the Leadership Team for direction on how to handle the situation.

K-6TH PARENTS

- If you have a child in the K-6th grade classes you must remain on campus while they are attending classes. You may send another adult in your place if needed once communicating with staff.
- If you have a student in K-3rd, please pick up your child 10 minutes prior to the hour to escort them to their next class. Our classes are 50 minutes long. Our teachers or class helpers cannot leave the class until all children have been picked up. If parents or an older sibling does not pick up the students, they will be escorted to the administration desk.

Student Responsibilities

- Be on time. Be prepared for class. All students need to come to class with paper, writing utensils, and any necessary items defined by their teacher for success in the class.
- No toys are permitted in class. This includes toys with wheels on them on campus, including but not limited to roller skates, roller blades, skateboards, bikes, shoes with wheel, etc.
- If students bring toys to play with during lunch, they must be regular playground type toys, and ones that they are willing to share with other students freely. Special toys and equipment should not be brought to campus.
- Please do not post to social media while on campus. Repeated violations of this by students will result in them losing the right to have a cellular device on campus.
- If you have a cell phone, it should not be seen or heard during class time. Please put your phones on silent during class – parents and students!
- Use of headphones or earphones during class is not allowed
- If there is inappropriate content/music found on your phone while you are on campus, your phone will be confiscated and your parent will be notified. We will not risk exposure of anything inappropriate getting into the hands of any of our students. Please be responsible with your cell phone use while on campus.
- Check Google Classroom for assignments from teachers, as directed by your parent, two to three times per week.

Volunteer Requirements:

- Complete a Volunteer Waiver
- Attend a training session (online or in person)
- Sign in weekly for your role

Note: More than one unexcused absence per semester will result in a \$10 fee

Volunteer Role Descriptions

Classroom Helper

Help create a calm, safe, and engaging classroom environment by supporting the teacher.

Responsibilities include:

- Contact the teacher before the semester to review expectations
- Assist with classroom management and activities
- Retrieve supplies or make copies as requested
- Help grade or collect assignments, if needed
- Learn class routines to sub if needed (once per semester)
- Support classroom transitions and clean-up
- Escort K-6 students to the student restrooms (see restroom protocol in Handbook)
- Assist with K-3 pickup or coverage between classes
- Sub for teacher briefly if they need to step out
- Communicate with teachers respectfully (not during instruction)

Floating Helper

- Check in weekly with Admin
- You may be asked to:
 - Assist in a class
 - Help with clean-up
 - Support other campus needs
- Sometimes you may not be needed—or called last-minute

Facilities/Admin Roles

Admin Helper (AM/PM)

- Assist with filing, distributing paperwork or miscellaneous admin duties
- Morning or afternoon flexibility

Lunch Clean-Up 1 & 2

- At 1:00 PM, check your assigned lunch area for:
 - Trash
 - Left belongings

Supply Room Helper

- Check in with the Academy Assistant
- Help with organizing, cleaning, or restocking, taking inventory

Playground & Lunch Supervision

Playground (Main Area or Field)

- Monitor students for safety
- Remind students of rules and safe play
- Report any issues to leadership
- Wear a vest for easy student recognition and a walkie talkie (pick up at Admin)
- Be ready to move between areas if needed
- Review lunch time rules in the Parent/Student Handbook

Lunch Clean-Up

- Pick up trash and lost items
- Empty trash cans
- Wipe tables and sweep under tables as needed

End of Day Clean-Up

- Break down admin area and help with end of day clean up
- Duties may include:
 - Wiping high-touch surfaces
 - Taking out trash
 - Sweeping/mopping/vacuuming
 - Follow the Admin's cleaning checklist
